There was general discussion about the ability to use various state provided GIS apps in conjunction with the City's GIS to select properties that would suit the Commissions requirements for various goals including potential projects that could be suggested for city owned land, and potential conservation easements.

D. Anson said that it would be productive to create a subcommittee to seek easements. L. Morin suggested that one be created to get better understanding of the City's management plans for various city owned property, and snow management practices.
